





Malama Makaha Effort Gaining Momentum



Makaha Valley, Hawaii - March 20, 2013 - In just two short months over 2,000 signatures have been collected by Malama Makaha in its petition campaign to save Makaha Beach from a short-sighted Bridge Replacement Project.

Malama Makaha wants to convince the State to reroute its current bridge replacement project around the mauka side of Makaha Beach Park. Rerouting the highway will allow the merging of Makaha Beach and Makaha Beach Park into one world-class recreational facility and solve the unsafe traffic situation created by having a highway separating these two features.

Malama Makaha member AL Frenzel states, "The leeward coast has been anticipating the merging of the beach and beach park ever since approval of a 1997 master plan for the beach park; if the current replacement project is allowed to go through as planned, the community's expectations for the park will never be achieved".

The Hawaii Department of Transportation is steadfast in its plan to proceed with the project to replace two wooden bridges in their current location. During construction, a temporary by-pass road will be built on the beach side of Farrington Highway. Frenzel says, "It's a shame they are rushing this project and ignoring the pleas of the community . . . the wooden bridges were recently refurbished in 2006 and 2009, they survived a brutal 100-year flood in 2008 and they have plenty of life in them, which would give the State plenty of time to step back and do this project right."

This Friday, Malama Makaha plans to hold another sign-waving awareness campaign along Farrington Highway by

Nanakuli Beach Park, March 22nd - live music and food is planned for the event. "A year ago only 8 people knew about this project, six months ago it was about 80; today we're probably around 4,000 - well on our way to the 30,000 voters who live on the leeward coast", Frenzel states.

"The sign-waving is a fun and worthy event. It's democracy in action and has been very effective in spreading the word on this short-sighted project that informed community members do not want".


Aloha Makai Ohana,

Heading 'To the Sea' with Kimié Miner

It's no surprise that singer/songwriter Kimié Miner looks to the sea for musical inspiration. The Big Island native has been moving and grooving to the ways of the ocean since she was a little curly-haired keiki. Now, the 27-year-old's an ambitious songstress looking to make a life around music – by first heading to the sea.

“The ocean is amazing because it’s powerful and majestic but can be rough at the same time,” says Kimié.

“That’s what life is like. You learn to enjoy it but be cautious.”

Caution might have been the last thing on her mind when playing at the beach as a kid; indeed, it might have also been what prevented Kimié from getting those “millions of scars from the ocean.” It’s quite possible she could retell a detailed account behind each one. But without those scars, there would be no stories

to tell and no lessons learned. The ocean, she explains, helped shape her into who she is today.

“I’m a cancer, so I always feel at home in the ocean,” explains KimiÉ, who grew up surfing, kayaking, paddle boarding and fishing. She admits she was the little tomboy of the family, tagging along with her brothers as they headed to the beach.

“My family had always been very ocean-minded,” she says. “That’s why the ocean has been a huge influence on us; I wrote a song called ‘Ocean’ and my (second) album is called ‘To the Sea.’”

In addition, she decided to shoot the album’s cover photo at her favorite Big Island beach. Located on the Kona coast, O’oma’s is where this water child first stood up on a surfboard many years ago. She reminisces over those long carefree days, playing in the waves with her family. Fast forward to today, and she’s still playing in those tumbling waves. KimiÉ’s album cover shows her joyfully swimming beneath the surf, like the mermaid she half-jokes about becoming.

“My parents always told us we had gills,” she laughs. “And I always say that when I get married, I want to come out of the sea, like a mermaid.”

Deeper than the ocean

Debating in March, “To the Sea” waxes with the ebbing sounds of India Arie-esque soulfulness interspersed with reggae rhythms. It is KimiÉ’s second album to date and debuted at number three on iTunes reggae charts, trailing closely behind Bob Marley’s iconic “Legends” album.

Made up of seven original tracks, “To the Sea” launched as a follow-up to her popular single “Shame on You.” The single itself hit the top spot on local radio stations. However, the album, she says, represents something deeper than the ocean.

“This album is me transitioning into a woman and crossing an ocean to get to L.A.,” explains KimiÉ, referring to her recent move to California to pursue a career in music. “The album also represents a transition in my music, from an island sound to an acoustic and urban soul (sound).”

There are lots of ways to mold the ocean metaphor around her quickly-evolving lifestyle. The most empowering, she points out, was her willingness to come out of that thick outer shell, common in a cancer’s crab zodiac sign.



Up until her college years at the University of San Diego, Kimié had been – what she calls – a “closet musician.”

“I was more of an internal artist; writing for myself, like a diary-style singer/songwriter would,” she explains. “I’d grab my guitar, sing a bunch of words but felt nervous sharing it with other people.”

The Kamehameha alum taught herself to play the guitar and had no problem jamming kanikapila in the backyard or at the beach with family and friends; the moon as her spotlight, she let go of her inhibitions and sang like there was no other way.

Little by little, though, she found ways to creep out of her comfort zone – putting together homemade CDs of her songs to give to her closest companions. Kimié even went to Hong Kong and recorded music for her big debut on Myspace, a popular Internet avenue for aspiring bands and musicians to take back then.

With such positive response in the cyber world and a burning passion for music, it would only seem natural to take the next step and pursue a professional career. But her shy cancer-like tendencies, she says, prevented her from fully sliding out of that shell – until meeting and touring with living legend Barrington Levy, that is.

Linked up with legendary Levy The Jamaican reggae and dancehall artist happen to be a friend of her friend’s. She jammed with him a couple of times during her college years, moving him with her sultry voice and ardor for music. The reggae legend was so moved, he decided to take Kimié under his wing.

Before she knew it, Kimié was recording music with Barrington in Jamaica and not long after, standing in front of thousands of screaming reggae devotees at his San Jose concert. That was the first of several shows she opened during his West Coast tour, forcing this once apprehensive artist to shed her stage fright almost instantly.

“It was a total sink or swim mentality for me,” she says. “I was so nervous and shy because I wasn’t known at all.”


It was just her and her guitar on stage, but Kimié didn’t sink in the least bit. Today, she continues to swim toward a higher goal and thanks Barrington for throwing her in the water, so to speak.

“What was drastic was him bringing me out of my shell...(and teaching me) to be more confident in myself,” she shares.

It was confidence and a sea of support from families, friends and fans that got her to where she is today, Kimié says.

Eager to take control of her own music and “stay true to herself,” she aimed to record and release her second album – “To the Sea” – independently and without a record label. That’s where she really felt the love from fellow supporters. Through a project-funding website called Kickstarter, Kimié raised more than \$9,000 to bring her second album to the surface.

“I really want to thank everyone who supported my Kickstarter,” she says. “Even if it wasn’t with money, you got the message out and supported me along the way.”

Her journey is only beginning to unfold, she says. Next up will be launching a full-length album later this year or early next year. Kimié has been busy recording, mixing and mastering with her production team and has already got several songs in the bag. All the while, continuously drawing inspiration from the ocean to guide her through this journey.







Sandy Beach has always been a great spot to get some prime photos and prime waves. There are moments when I hold the shutter button of my camera down in hopes to capture something good. In that case, I was left with this alluring shot of a nice Sandy's Barrel.



The stretch of Kalaniana'ole Highway connecting Sandy beach and China Walls yields some amazing sights. If you've ever driven past Halona Blowhole and seen water spewing out, this is how it is for a thousandth of a second - 3 feet away.



This shot may be quite hard to comprehend upon first glance, though it is because there is absence of any opening to the outside. Here, you are allowed a prime view of the inside of a closed barrel at Sandy Beach.



In my opinion, this photo shows exactly why shore break is fun to play in. It is a wide shot of a Sandy's body boarder who has just about reached the end of his short ride. Though, the element of this photo that steals my attention is the detail in the water from its displacement. If it weren't for a 1/1250th of a second shutter speed, I would have never been able to capture the pristine characteristics of this moment in time.





There is only one word in my mind that describes this photo, glass. I was heading back to the beach after some paddling around the bay on my surf ski when I noticed how beautiful this sunset looked. The pinkish-orange haze reflecting off of the water only made it a sight not to be missed.

This was the shot that got me started with Ocean-type photography. A nice visit to Waimea Bay on our Northerly Shores allowed me to capture this minute wave a millisecond before it broke.



This shot was taken at a spot that I believe possesses the nicest, if not, the best break on the Southeastern side of Oahu (which is usually not very populated). This shot captivates me because of the detail shown in the water. As you progress further on into the picture (in terms of depth), the water becomes stirred to the point where you can see the bottom of a breaking wave. Amazing waves brings amazing captures when it comes to photographs, no matter if it is the inside, outside, or underside of the wave being taken.

Hawaiians Moore & Payne Crowned 2013 Drug Aware Margaret River Pro Champions



Carissa Moore of Oahu, Hawaii and Dusty Payne from Maui, Hawaii, have both claimed victory at the Drug Aware Margaret River Pro in solid surf. Both surfers fought through a stacked field of the world's best to claim their respective wins and etch their names in the history books as winners at the world-class Surfers Point, Margaret River, WA, Australia.

Stop No. 2 of 8 on the ASP Women's World Championship Tour, the 2013 Drug Aware Margaret River Pro has seen Tyler Wright retain the ASP Women's World No. 1 position after finishing runner-up to Moore. The rest of the surfers moved and shuffled around the rankings, with last year's top 4 further stretching the gap between them and the rest.

The Drug Aware Margaret River Pro is the first men's ASP PRIME rated event for the 2013 season, offering maximum points towards 2014 ASP World Championship Tour qualification campaigns. The final four surfers left standing in this event were all elite ASP World Championship Tour surfers, taking the lion's share of all the points and prize-money on offer.

Carissa Moore (HAW) claimed her first ASP Women's WCT event win in over a year, showing how deadly she can be in big and powerful surf. Moore now moves up to be the ASP World No. 2 ranked surfer, in what is already shaping up to be an exciting ASP Women's World Title race after only two events.

"I'm feeling really, really amazing right now!" said Moore. "I'm stoked to walk away with the win and to be up on the podium again. I didn't win an event last year, and it was hard for me, but it definitely fired me up. It's only been two events and it's already looking like it will be a close ASP Women's World Title race, but there are girls who didn't make it to the final day who are capable of causing upsets and winning events. It will be really interesting to see how it all pans out."

Dusty Payne (HAW) was the form surfer of the 2013 Drug Aware Margaret River Pro and stormed through the draw all the way to his first major ASP event win. Payne showcased his raw and powerful brand of surfing in the solid waves at Surfer's Point all event and sealed his win with a near-perfect 9.23 (out of a possible 10) in the final.

"I've never won anything before, this is sick!" Payne said. "This is my first major win and this is an awesome event. I'm so glad to win in Western Australia, I love it over here! I was in good rhythm at the event, which never happens, lucky I guess. I'm just so stoked right now. I was injured for half of last year and had to sit on the sidelines and watch my friends surf and win events, and now here I am. It feels great."

Hawaii's Own Carissa Moore Current Number One after Rip Curl Women's Pro Bells Beach

BELLS BEACH, Victoria/AUS – Carissa Moore of Honolulu, Hawaii claimed the 2013 Rip Curl Women's Pro Bells Beach presented by Ford, over Tyler Wright of Australia in clean three-to-five foot waves at Bells Beach. Moore's win vaults the young Hawaiian back into the lead on the ASP Women's World Championship Tour (WCT) ratings for the first time in over a year.

"To win Bells is a dream," Moore said. "As a little kid, you always looked forward to watching it and reading about it. The history and the prestige and the people who have won it are really legendary. To be a part of it now is really special."

After opening the heat with a 9.57 on her first wave, Moore survived a psychologically-draining 25-minute lull in action before she and Wright battled it out in a final exchange in the dying moments.

"It wasn't an easy heat," Moore said. "I was fortunate to get a good score to start, but Tyler (Wright) is really powerful and a really fierce competitor. If she got the waves, it was going to be a challenge. We had a really long lull during the heat and then a little flurry at the end."

The win marks Moore's second in a row this season, previously collecting a victory in Western Australia last week, and the Hawaiian now sits in the driver's seat in this season's race for the 2013 ASP Women's World Title.

"It feels great to be a part of the World Title race again this year," Moore said. "Last year wasn't the greatest for me and it was an adjustment transitioning from going for a world title to defending one. I learned a lot though and I'm back this year feeling focused with a great support group around me. It's still early in the season so I'm just going to stay focused on the next event."

Wright, a standout on last Saturday's marathon day of competition, was unable to capitalize during her third, consecutive Finals' berth of the season and drops from ASP WCT No. 1 to ASP WCT No. 2 heading into the fourth event of the season.

"It's disappointing for sure," Wright said. "I felt like I was surfing well all week and I really wanted to ring the bell. The waves just didn't deliver for us though. Congrats to Carissa (Moore) though. She was ripping and I'll try to go one better at New Zealand."

Lua Wa'a! Double Outrigger Canoe Surfing.

A double hull canoe is two OC4s (4 man outrigger canoe) leashed together.

Chris Kauwe was paddling a double hull canoe back to the beach after doing a "Santa" event and chased and rode a wave in. Afterword he was hooked on the idea of catching more waves in the double hull canoe. A few days later he assembled a crew of 6 and chased/rode some more waves and got really stoked! Eventually I got a call from Kauwe describing what he was up to. I could feel his enthusiasm 5000 miles away, through the phone. I was like "sign me up!" On the plane to Kauai all I could think about how the double hull canoe would flow on the wave and how it would be steered with two steersman.

I was saturated with anticipation when we drove to the double hull canoe and got it all ready. We carried our steering blades over to the canoe, checked the 6' 4"x4" iako, the rubber leashing and attached a few go-pro cameras for the "documentary."

With out a crew we pushed the double hull canoe into the water and started paddling out to the line up. It was just 2 paddlers and two canoes lashed together and some nice clean mini waves waiting to be chased. Getting out to the take off spot was smooth. The coolest thing about the canoe surfing is building up speed on the wave and anticipating what your steers partner is going to do on the wave. Synchronized steering!

Wave after wave we were so happy, laughing and smiling and repeating the same game over and over again.

On the beach we discussed how practical a double hull canoe could be for a coastal trip with a few friends. One could sail it, paddle it, surf it and have all sorts of gear on it.. The double hull canoe is going to take us places!
